Block of the Month - March 2010

Use a SCANT 1/4" seam allow

Fabric 1
One - 4 1/2" square
Eight - 2 1/2" squares



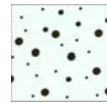
Fabric 2
Four -
2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles



Fabric 3
Two - 5" squares



Background
Two - 5" squares
Four -
2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles



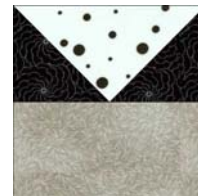
Take the two 5" Fabric 3 squares and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side. Place right sides together with the Background squares and sew a *scant* 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the line, open and press toward the darker fabric and trim to 4 1/2". You will have four half square triangles.



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the eight Fabric 1 squares. Place a square right sides together with a Background rectangle. Sew on the drawn line, trim 1/4" away from the line, open and press toward Fabric 1. Repeat on the opposite corner of the rectangle. Make four, should measure 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".



Add a Fabric 2 rectangle to the Flying Geese units.



Make two rows that look like this.



Make one row that looks like this.



Join rows to complete block.
This is the Big T block (I don't
know who named it or why) and
it should measure 12 1/2'.
